**Admission to the Undergraduate courses in MBBS/BDS/B.E/B. Pharmacy, Diploma in Engineering and Diploma in Pharmacy under “Self Financing Scheme” for the year 2013-2014.**

Applications from Mauritian students are invited in prescribed form for above-mentioned courses. Selected candidates will be allotted seats earmarked for foreign students.

**Eligibility**

- (1) **MBBS/BDS** : Minimum of 60% aggregate marks in 10+2 examination in India or its equivalent (HSC/GCE A level) with minimum 60% in Physics Chemistry and Biology (Botany & Zoology) and 50% in English
- (2) **B.E.** : Minimum of 60% aggregate marks in 10+2 examination in India or its equivalent (HSC/GCE A level) with minimum 60% in Physics Chemistry and Maths and 50% in English
- (3) **B.Pharmacy  
Diploma in Pharmacy** : Minimum of 60% aggregate marks in 10+2 examination in India or its equivalent (HSC/GCE A level) with minimum 60% in Physics Chemistry and Biology (Botany & Zoology) and 50% in English
- (4) **Diploma in Engineering** : Minimum of 60% aggregate marks in 10+2 examination in India or its equivalent (HSC/GCE A level) with minimum 60% in Physics Chemistry and Maths in the first attempt and 50% in English in 10<sup>th</sup> (or its equivalent) as well in 12<sup>th</sup> (or its equivalent)

(i) For admission to 1<sup>st</sup> year Diploma in Engineering course, the age limit of the candidate should be below 21 years as on 1.8.2013.

(ii) Some Directorates of Technical Education require that the minimum aggregate marks should be obtained in the first attempt.

**Note:** # The aspiring candidates for MBBS/BDS seats may have to appear in the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) and obtain required marks to be considered for earmarked seats. Since the matter is under consideration before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India for relaxing the condition of appearing in National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) from the academic year 2013-14 for foreign national students to be nominated by Ministry of External Affairs so candidates are advised to check on regular basis the position on the websites of Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE)/ Medical Council of India (MCI) whether they are required to appear in the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) and obtain required marks in the test.

# A certificate from the Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi that the candidate's qualifying examination is equivalent to 10+2 standard of CBSE in India for the purpose of admission to MBBS/BDS/B.E/B. Pharmacy/Diploma in Engineering/Diploma in Pharmacy courses must be enclosed.
