Notice Inviting Tender


The High Commission of India invites sealed tenders from experienced Mauritius based companies for water-proofing of "tiled" flooring of Balcony on the first floor of the Main house / building (India House) located at Angus Lane, Vacoas. The quotation would be for entire work on lump-sum basis and should be covered with guarantee of a period of at least five (05) years. The specific conditions of tender are stated at Annexure A.

The tender should be submitted in two separate sealed envelopes. The first envelope should contain the details of qualification, past experience of the company and name of satisfied clients. The second envelope should clearly mention the amount and time required for completion of work along-with the details of the work and type of material with quantity to be used.

The sealed envelopes should be marked as "Technical Experience for water-proofing work" and "Financial Tender for Water-proofing of flooring of Balcony of main house / building" respectively and addressed to Mrs. Devi Gopinath, Head of Chancery, High Commission of India, 6th floor, LIC Building, Port Louis. Conditions of Tender for Water-proofing work of Balcony at India House

1. The payments would be released in instalments linked with progress / stages of work or after certified completion of work as per payment plan (negotiated and agreed by High Commission of India and Contractor).
2. The Retention money would be 10 % of tender cost to be paid after one year of date of completion of work.
3. Once the time period for completion of work has been negotiated, the work will have to be completed within the agreed time-frame.
4. The Contractor would ensure that workers start the work at the site as soon as possible but not later than one week after the award of work as per time schedule prepared by Contractor and approved by High Commission of India.
5. Liquidated damages would be levied at the rate of 2% of approved tendered cost on Contractor for each day of delay unless the High Commission of India is convinced that there were compelling reasons beyond the Contractor's control for the delay.
6. The Contractor would be responsible for protection of the area of work from storm, rain and cyclone till completion of work.
